I can create work that explores the transition from organic to mechanical form.
Unit 2: Complex Idea Investigation	 I can reflect on my ideas/views of the world and identify one aspect of my life that is complex, and requires an image to visualize my feelings. I can create, combine, and edit preliminary work to explore ideas in my artwork, and complete a final work that represents my intentional, complex idea.
Unit 3: Research	I can describe, analyze, interpret, and judge art, and can express my reactions concisely in writing.
Unit 4: Portfolio	 I can continue to build upon my emerging style by completing an extension of previous series & portfolio work representing my understanding of the world. I can compile my artwork from current and past bodies of work to create a portfolio.
