Unit 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the equipment that is available for your use and note its location in the classroom • List notions, supplies, and small equipment needed to construct a project. • Locate and explain the function of various sewing parts • Operate a sewing machine • Wind bobbin and thread • Identify how body measurements are taken for both men and women • Use a measurement chart to find your body type and pattern size • Identify the various types of information that may be found in a pattern envelope • Explain how fabric construction and applied finishes affect fabric characteristics
Unit 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify grain lines in various types of fabric • Determine whether fabric is on grain • Determine when fabric should be preshrunk • Analyze and interpret the construction diagrams used on an instruction sheet • Identify various hand stitches and when to use them
Unit 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the meanings of various pattern symbols • Demonstrate an understanding of pattern symbols by sketching symbols in appropriate locations on several pattern pieces • Determine when to make pattern adjustments by comparing your measurements with those on a pattern • List reasons for layout, pinning and cutting procedures • Correctly layout a pattern • Describe the uses of various pressing equipment • Identify the difference between pressing and ironing and when to use each • Stay stitch a garment piece

Unit 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the various types of interfacing and when to use each type • Identify the various hemming methods available • Construct various types of hems on scrap material • Demonstrate creating buttonholes using a sewing machine • Explain how sergers make sewing fast and easy and how they differ from conventional machines • Identify different types of serger stitches • Operate a serger • Observe construction techniques of sergers such as seaming, hemming, and decorative stitching
